Spay/Neuter Financial Assistance Fund

The Humane Society maintains an earmarked fund to help community residents spay/neuter their pet. Residents needing financial assistance may pick up a certificate good for \$50/spay or \$25/neuter. This certificate is given to the vet at the time of sterilization and the amount invoiced to the Humane Society. Since 1999, the Humane Society has helped pay for the sterilization of 1,300 owned animals. Funds for this program come from earmarked donations and grants from Narragansett #1 Foundation, Krumholz Foundation, DJ&T Foundation, and United-Mid Coast Charities.

Feral Cat Trap, Neuter & Return Fund

Feral cat communities (groups of un-owned, wild cats) are not uncommon in the mid-coast region. Transfer stations, wharves and barns are common locations. When someone is willing to take responsibility for feeding these communities, we'll take responsibility for getting the cats spayed and neutered. Testing and sterilization of these felines can cost anywhere from \$60-\$100 dollars. Donations in any amount are welcomed.
