We found him (Trent) on your site and immediately knew he was the dog for us. Our dog, Ty, had passed away more than a year before and we had been feeling that we were ready to adopt again. We did a search of shelters in Maine and for some reason HSKC came up on top. We opened your site, and only your site, after seeing Trent on the upper right side. We came up that day and he was ours. We love the story of how we came together and I had wanted to put it in writing for the HSKC at some point in his memory. Trent passed away last May after being diagnosed with an aggressive form of Lupus. He was a beautiful boy and I don't have words to describe just how much we love him and the joy he brought to our lives. We think about him every day.

We adopted Trent a few weeks before I was diagnosed with cancer and he passed away a month after I was deemed in clinical remission. We always felt like he was my gift and God's way of letting me know I wasn't forgotten. So, thank you to the HSKC for one of the greatest gifts of our lives.

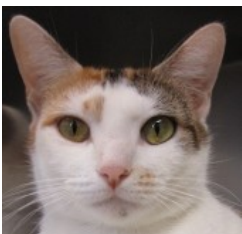
Looking Forward and Giving Back **HSKC Legacy Society**
